

Welcome to the world of orchestra! This handbook contains all of the basics and need-to-know facts for the entire school year.

Playing a string instrument can provide many years of enjoyment and growth for your young musician. There are many opportunities for orchestral participation throughout their K-12 education and into college! Playing a string instrument is fun, socially engaging, rewarding, and yes, sometimes a challenge (as everything in the learning process often is). Participating in the school orchestra program contributes to overall "well-roundedness" that colleges and universities look for in prospective students – and scholarships are always a possibility!

Required Materials and Expenses

1. Instrument: Austin's Violin Shop and Seman Violins are music stores that will provide <u>string</u> <u>instrument rentals</u> for your child. We have a good working relationship with these vendors and they visit our school district on a weekly basis. The high quality of their instruments, the service of their staff, and their pricing make either of these two stores the best choice for providing your child with an instrument.

***For your convenience:** Austin's Violin Shop and Seman Violins service our school district and can deliver instruments and accessories at any time.

If you have financial difficulty, we have a limited number of school instruments and sizes that can be rented. Please contact Mr. Ladendorf or Ms. Kline as soon as possible. All information is confidential

2. Required Method Book: All 5th grade students should have this method book for their lessons. All 4th grade students will receive this book in the Spring of their first year in orchestra. The method book series for our elementary curriculum is <u>String Basics Book 1</u>. Please make sure you have the correct book for your child's instrument.



3. School District Fee for Elementary Orchestra: \$80.00 which can be paid through your district account on MySchoolBucks.com or through your school's secretary. This fee must be paid before the first lesson.

4. Folding Music Stand – needed for practicing at home: A folding music stand is required for home practice so students will play with correct posture. This can be purchased with your rental. The teachers will show your child how to use it and adjust it to the proper height.

5. Cloth/Towel: To put in your child's case to wipe off rosin. This will help the students keep the instrument clean, prevent damage to the varnish, and will keep the strings sounding like new. An old kitchen washcloth will do.

6. Rosin: This will come with your rental. It is necessary for when your child starts playing with the bow.

7. Shoulder Rest (violin and viola), Zero-Strap (cello), or Rock-stop (bass): This is necessary for proper posture. We strongly recommend the Kun or Everest brands for the shoulder rest, because of their durability and cost. All zero-straps and rock-stops work well for cello and bass students as long as they are kept clean.

8. Pencil: Please keep a **pencil** (not pen) in your instrument case or orchestra folder <u>at all times.</u> We write in our music and our method book all the time.

9. Technology: Chromebook or other device to access specific websites (at home). We also highly recommend an additional device (iPod, iPad, iPhone, or other) for specific apps which will help with your child's learning.

The Difference Between "Lessons", "Practicing", and "Rehearsals"...

Lessons (during the school day)

Every beginning student receives one, thirty-minute lesson each week during the school day. This is when we teach them how to play their instruments and it's when we can give the best, individualized instruction to your child. Students will miss class-time with their homeroom teacher every week. This schedule is worked out with the classroom teacher and is done with their approval. Students are responsible for catching up with any material or activities missed during their absence from their homeroom.

Lessons will begin the week of <u>September 6, 2022 for all students</u>. ALL FEES MUST BE PAID AT THIS TIME. All students need to have their instruments and books by this date.

Practicing (at home)

Practicing is very important to every musician, from the beginner/novice to the advanced professionals and it is defined as musicians playing their music at home and actively working to improve. **Practicing should be done daily, for however many minutes you can set aside**. Without consistent practice, students will learn slower and feel like they're not making progress.

Rehearsals (after school)

Rehearsal schedules and locations vary depending on your child's grade and elementary school. Please see pages 5 - 7 for details about our after-school orchestra rehearsals.

Concert/Performance Dress Code

All students are required to dress up for our concerts.

Option 1: White on top, black on bottom. All clothing must be formal (i. e. no T-shirts, polo shirts, jeans, sweats, shorts, sneakers, flip-flops, etc...). If a student wears a button down shirt, a black neck tie is required. If a student wears a skirt or a dress, the hem should be below the knees. If the hem is above the knees, the student must wear black tights or leggings.

Option 2: All black. All clothing must be formal (i. e. no T-shirts, polo shirts, jeans, sweats, shorts, sneakers, flip-flops, etc...). If a student wears a button down shirt, a black neck tie is required. If a student wears a skirt or a dress, the hem should be below the knees. If the hem is above the knees, the student must wear black tights or leggings.
